Discus circle / cage/net . Width of opening of cage.	Athletes / Officials Substantial	Assess conditions of circle – dry / clean. Check after each turn. Ensure correct safety procedures in place for all competitors waiting to their turn – behind cage with no-one standing to side of cage or within 2 metres of cage. No competitor to collect discus after their turn. Lead Official to advise on position of measuring and retrieving officials – no children in these positions. Discus always carried (not rolled) back to cage by an official. Horn blast by lead official to warn everyone that the next throw is about to take place. Lead official to check that no one from another event has walked in to danger areas.	Improved – low risk.	Lead Official/Referee to advise on safety procedures throughout competition. Exclude if anyone does not adhere to all rules. PLEASE NOTE: THE WARNING HORN BLAST IS TO TELL OFFICIALS THAT A THROW IS IMMINENT – THIS IS NOT A SIGNAL TO THE ATHLETE TO THROW.
