The Northumberland Schools' Athletic Association was formed in 1949.

The first county championship was then held on 9th July, 1949 at Gosforth and a team sent to the 1949 ESAA Championship at Carshalton.

They were successful in their first ESAA Championship with Ron Henderson of Wallsend District taking the Boys Junior 880 yards title in a record time of 2 min 9.2 secs.

Northumberland hosted the ESAA Championship for the first time in 1954 when it was held in Ashington. Over 1,700 competitors from 39 counties took part.

MULTI-SPORT ATHLETE

Many athletes who competed in the English Schools' Athletic Association (ESAA) Championships have become very successful in a wide variety of sports including Bobsleigh, Boxing, Cricket, Cycling, Darts, Football, Hockey, Modern Pentathlon, Netball, Powerlifting, Rowing, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Skeleton, Triathlon and Weightlifting.

Details follow of a Northumberland ESAA competitor who went on to have a successful career in another sport :

FOOTBALL – LUCY BRONZE MBE

Lucy represented Northumberland when finishing 16th in the 2006 ESAA Junior Pentathlon. At this time Lucy was captain of the Sunderland FC Under-16 football team.

She played for the Sunderland first team from 2007 to 2010 and then for Everton before signing for Liverpool in 2012. In 2013 Lucy was awarded her first cap for England. Moves to Manchester City (2014) and Olympique Lyonnais (2017) followed. She returned to Manchester City in 2020 and became the first England player to win *The Best FIFA Women's Player Award*.

In 2022 Lucy joined Barcelona and was a member of the England team which won the UEFA Women's Euro 2022 Championship.

As of February 2024, she had amassed 119 caps for England and 4 for Great Britain.

Lucy was awarded the MBE in the 2023 Honours List.
